This is a reconstruction of Playford's The English Dancing Master, First Edition. This first section will be some explanations and a glossary of terms I use. I welcome any feedback, especially improvements, on this work. My email is Brocc@Juno.com. I also want to thank the Crosston Dance Practice without whom this would not have been done.

NOTE: In some of the dances, Playford has "as many couples as will" but has only the first two couples performing most of the dance and these two couples never integrating the remaining couples into the dance. I have taken the liberty of stating that these dances are for an even number of couples and having the odd couples perform the parts done by the first couple and the even couples perform the parts done by the second couple. Otherwise everyone except the first two couples would be very bored.

I have also taken the liberty of assigning lefts and rights. Most of the time Playford does not specify.

## Starting a New Dance

Beginning stance standing relaxed but straight and facing forward. Feet about shoulder width apart.

When holding another's hand, hold at a level comfortable for both people. The man's hand is underneath the woman's hand. When in doubt the woman should be comfortable.

For ease of description, and consistency with Playford, it is assumed that all couples are male and female standing side by side with the male leading and on the left, unless otherwise stated.

The numbers at the start of a line indicate the number of beats of music for a given maneuver. There will sometimes be a fudge factor of a beat or two (most often when there is " 0 " time for a maneuver, the preceding or subsequent maneuver is fudged).

All of these dances begin with stepping forward or to the side with the left foot and progressing with alternating feet from there. Playford does not specify which foot to start with, however, the other dance manuals from this period which specify a foot generally have the dancer leading with their left foot.

I have italicized the terms defined in this section as they appear in the reconstructions EXCEPT couple, M1, W1, C1, M2, W2, C2, M3, W3, C3, M4, W4 and C4.

## Terms Relating to the Hall

Head of the hall- the front of the hall, where the royalty is sitting if they are sitting in state and watching.

Bottom of the hall- the end of the hall opposite the head of the hall.
Up/up the hall- toward the head of the hall.
Down/down the hall- toward the bottom of the hall.
Group- The group of people you are dancing with. (NOTE: this is also sometimes called a set by other dancers.)

Pattern- a portion of a dance used for reference, frequently being repeated.
Fudge Factor- a step or motion for which the music allows no time such as turning to face your partner.

## Terms Relating to People

Couple- two people dancing together, depicted as a man and a woman in Playford.

Partner- the person you are dancing with, the other member of your couple.
Contrary- the person of the opposite sex who is dancing in the couple facing you in your group as you are positioned at the start of the dance.

Corner- the person of the opposite sex dancing beside you in your group who is not your partner as you are positioned at the start of the dance.

Next- the person of the opposite sex who is in your group of eight and not your partner, contrary or corner as you are positioned at the start of the dance.

C 1 , couple one-The couple closest to the head of the hall at the start of the dance.
C 2 , couple two- The couple immediately behind C 1 (or to the right of man 1 and left of woman 1) in a line. If you are in a group of 4 couples then C 2 is immediately to the left of C 1 . If you are in a circle C 2 is to the right of C 1 .

C3, couple three - The couple immediately behind C2 (or to the right of man 2 and left of woman 2) in a line. If you are in a group of 4 couples then C 3 is opposite C 1 . If you are in a circle C 3 is to the right of C 2 .

C4- The couple immediately behind C3 (or to the right of man 3 and left of woman 3) in a line. If you are in a group of 4 couples then C 4 is opposite C 2 . If you are in a circle C 4 is to the right of C 3 .

M1, first man- the man in C1.

W1, first woman- the woman in C1

M2, second man- the man in C2.
W2, second woman- the woman in C2.
M3, third man- the man in C3.
W3, third woman- the woman in C3.
M4, fourth man- the man in C4.
W4, fourth woman- the woman in C 4 .
Terms Relating to Groups/Examples of lines/groups:
A group of four facing each other:

A group of three couples in a line by couple:
M1 W1
M2 W2

## Terms Relating to Actions Taken while Dancing

Step- moving a foot in the intended direction about $30 \mathrm{~cm} / \mathrm{one}$ foot and putting weight on it.

Close- to bring the foot that did not take the last action to rest next to the foot that took the last action. Frequently the closing foot is doing the next action so it will be more of a touch than a full step in which you transfer your weight.

Single- is one step in a direction sometimes followed by a close. Typically, and for the purposes of this reconstruction, it is done in two beats unless otherwise specified.

Double- is three steps followed by a close. Typically, and for the purposes of this reconstruction, it is done in four beats unless otherwise specified.

Up a double and back- Walk a double forward and then backward to your original place. Usually done in eight beats four up and four back holding the hand of the person you are doing this with if there is another person.

Slip/slipping- Sideways steps in the indicated direction. If at the start of the dance where you would otherwise typically see an up a double and back, eight slipping steps are done, usually, clockwise in eight beats.

Circle- Slipping clockwise unless otherwise noted. Usually done in eight beats. Typically the dancers hold hands with the people next to them to form the circle.

Siding- a double toward your partner at a slight angle so that you meet the same shoulders and a double back to place. Usually done in eight beats four to meet and four back.

Side left- Siding to meet right shoulders (you are moving left and lead with your left foot).

Side right- Siding to meet left shoulders (you are moving right and lead with your right foot).

Arm- cup the indicated elbow of your partner in your hand (right elbow in right hand or left elbow in left hand) your partner is doing the same, and walk in a circle as if your joined arms were a pole. When right arms are joined lead with your left foot and go clockwise. When left arms are joined lead with your right foot and go counter-clockwise. Usually done in eight beats to get all the way around.

Set- step sideways and close usually done in two beats.
Turn- three small steps to turn around in place counter-clockwise unless otherwise specified. Usually done in four beats.
Set and turn left- Typically, and for the purposes of this reconstruction, it is facing the person you are currently dancing with, unless otherwise specified, set left in two beats, set right in two beats, turn over your left shoulder, counter-clockwise, in four beats.

Set and turn right- Typically, and for the purposes of this reconstruction, it is facing the person you are currently dancing with, unless otherwise specified, set right in two beats, set left in two beats, turn over your right shoulder, clockwise, in four beats.

Cast- Very similar to a turn, but you go in a small circle away from the person you are dancing with, usually back to place and usually in four or eight beats. Sometimes you cast the length of the group in which case you will walk down the length of the group and back up usually with the first person leading all the other people of their sex in the group in a procession.

Reverence- acknowledging your partner with a bow if a man or a curtsey if you are a woman. The style of reverence changed over the years, but generally for men take a step back with your right leg and bend down at the left knee. Keep your back straight so you can maintain eye contact with your partner. For women bend down at the knees. Keep your back straight so you can continue to maintain eye contact with your partner.

Turn your partner/contrary- join both hands with your partner/contrary, left hands with right hands, and walk in a full circle as if doing the arm figure.

Hey in a line- these heys are typically done in the same sex line of your group. Walking a "figure 8 type" pattern within a portion of your group. Usually this is done with three people. The first person in the line faces the second and third persons. The third person is looking at the back of the second person. All people in the hey begin walking along the line they are in. The first person in line passes right shoulders with the second person in line then goes between the second and third persons to pass left shoulders with the third person. While the first and third persons are passing, the second person is going around an imaginary person at the head of the line by left shoulders and will find the third person ready to pass right shoulders with the second person as the first person is passing right shoulders and going around an imaginary person at the bottom of the line. You progress until the first and third persons return to the places in the dance they occupied before the hey began. If there are four people in the line, the first and second people face each other while the third and fourth people face each other and proceed through the hey
starting with right shoulders and proceeding with alternating shoulders with the next person until everyone returns to their original positions.

Hey in a line of four couples- The same as a Hey in a line, except the first exchanges are simultaneously between M1 and M2 while M3 and M4 change with the respective women doing the same as their partners.

Hey in a group- This is described for C 1 and M 2 , but can be adapted to anywhere in the group. W1 walks between M1 and M2 to M2's place passing left shoulders with M2. M2 goes behind the passing W1 to M1's place and M1 goes to W1's place.
M1 walks between W1 and M2 to M2's place passing left shoulders with W1. W1, goes behind the passing M1 to M1's place and M2 goes to W1's place. M2 walks between W1 and M1 to M2's place passing left shoulders with M1. M1, goes behind the passing M2 to M1's place and W1 goes to W1's place. The weaving should flow like the hey in a line.

Hey for four- Change places with the person you are facing, unless otherwise indicated (partner or contrary) in four beats then change places with the other person of the opposite sex in four beats then change places with the first person you changed places with in four beats then change places with the other person of the opposite sex in four beats to return to your original place.

Hey as a group- perform the line hey, but when you get to the end of the line continue the hey with the person at the end of the other line, so in a group of three couples, at the first and third person spots instead of an imaginary person, you will continue doing the hey with the person on the end of the other line crossing over to the other line.

## ADSANS SARABAND

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 Men turn away so your backs are toward your partner and walk a double forward.
4 Men turn to face your partner and walk a double forward.
8 Men set and turn left.
4 Women turn away so your backs are toward your partner and walk a double forward.
4 Women turn to face your partner and walk a double forward.
8 Women set and turn left.
2 Men go down the hall a single while women go up the hall a single.
4 All dancers slip a double to the left to wind up in the line of the opposite gender.
2 All dancers single backwards.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
2 Men go up the hall a single while women go down the hall a single.
4 All dancers slip a double to the left.
2 All dancers single backwards to your original places.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 All dancers do half a hey in line with C 1 starting by going inside C 2 .
8 All dancers set and turn left facing your partner.
8 All dancers do half a hey in line with C 1 starting by going inside C 2 .
8 All dancers set and turn right facing your partner.
8 While facing up the hall, all dancers slip eight slips to the left.
8 All dancers set and turn left facing your partner.
8 M1 and M3 go behind M2 to meet and double back while women's side does the same. 8 M1 and M3 go behind M2 and turn as you would turn your partner and return to your original places while women's side does the same while C2 turn your partner.

8 All dancers change places with your partner by left shoulders in two doubles. 8 All dancers set and turn right facing your partner.
16 C 1 lead down the middle and then change places at the bottom of the hall and lead up the middle back to your original places with the other dancers following in their respective lines.

## AL-A-MODE DE FRANCE

This dance is for as many couples as wish in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 C1 double to meet face to face
4 C1 take both hands and slip down the hall between C2.
4 C 1 face person of the same sex in C2
4 C1 "push" C2 a double backward out of the group.
8 C 1 and C 2 double toward your partner then back.
8 C 1 and C2 turn your partner.
C1 progresses with this figure until they are at the bottom of the line and then work their way back up as the other couples progress down.
Once C3 is immediately to the right of C2, C2 begins the sequence with all couples eventually being engaged. Continue until all couples have done a full circuit of the group.

8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
0 All dancers form a single line M1 then W1 then M2 then W2 and so on.
8 All dancers arm right with your partner.
8 All dancers arm left with your partner.
4 While still facing your partner, all dancers slip a double to the left.
4 All dancers slip a double to the right to reform the line.
4 All dancers slip a double to the right.
4 All dancers slip a double to the left to reform the line.

4 (for each double) M1 double to his original place then W1 double to her original place then M2 double to his original place then W2 double to her original place and so on until all dancers have resumed their original places.

4 (for each pass) C 1 starts a hey with their right hands with each other and progressing down the line of the opposite sex until all dancers have completed the hey in a line using your hands instead of just passing shoulders and changing to the other line at the ends so that you progress down the hall in the line of the opposite sex and up the hall in the line of your own sex.

## ALL IN A GARDEN GREENE

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 (2 per shake) M1, while traveling down the hall, shake W1's hand then W2's hand then W3's right hand then her left hand.
2 M1 kiss W3 twice.
6 M1 turn W3 as you would turn your partner.
8 (2 per shake) M1, while traveling up the hall, shake W3's hand then W2's hand then W1's right hand then her left hand.
2 M1 kiss W1 twice.
6 M1 turn your partner.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 (2 per shake) W1, while traveling down the hall, shake M1's hand then M2's hand then M3's right hand then his left hand.
2 W1 kiss M3 twice.
6 W1 turn M3 as you would turn your partner.
8 (2 per shake) W1, while traveling up the hall, shake M3's hand then M2's hand then M1's right hand then his left hand.
2 W1 kiss the M1 twice.
6 W1 turn your partner.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers set and turn left.

8 All dancers arm left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 (2 per shake) M1, while traveling down the hall, shake W1's hand then W2's hand then W3's right hand then her left hand.
2 M1 kiss W3 twice.
6 M1 turn W3 as you would turn your partner.
8 (2 per shake) M1, while traveling up the hall, shake W3's hand then W2's hand then W1's right hand then her left hand.
2 M1 kiss W1 twice.
6 M1 turn your partner.

## AN OLD MAN IS A BED FULL OF BONES

This dance is for as many couples as wish in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 C 1 face down the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) C 1 go to the bottom of the group.
8 C1 turn your partner.
8 M1 and last woman face up the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) M1 and last woman go to the top of the group.
8 M1 and last woman turn as you would turn your partner.
8 Last man and W1 face up the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8s as needed) Last man and W1 go to the top of the group.
8 Last man and W1 turn as you would turn your partner.
8 Last couple face down the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) Last couple go to the bottom of the group.
8 Last couple turn your partner.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 C 1 face down the hall and while holding your partner's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand, do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) M1 and W1 go to the bottom of the group while still holding your partner's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 C1 turn your partner while still holding your partner's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.

8 M1 and last woman face up the hall and do a double forward and back while holding each other's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand. 8 (or as many 8 s as needed) M1 and last woman go to the top of the group while holding each other's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand. 8 M1 and last woman turn as you would turn your partner while holding each other's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 Last man and W1 face up the hall and do a double forward and back while holding each other's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) Last man and W1 go to the top of the group while holding each other's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 Last man and W1 turn as you would turn your partner while holding each other's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 Last couple face down the hall and do a double forward and back while holding your partner's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) Last couple go to the bottom of the group while holding your partner's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.
8 Last couple turn your partner while holding your partner's left hand in your left hand and their right hand in your right hand.

8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers arm left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 C 1 face down the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) C 1 go to the bottom of the group at the bottom the woman turns under the man's arm and he kisses her.
8 C1 turn your partner.
8 M1 and last woman face up the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) M1 and last woman go to the top of the group at the top the woman turns under the man's arm and he kisses her.
8 M 1 and last woman turn as you would turn your partner.
8 Last man and W1 face up the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) Last man and W1 go to the top of the group at the top the woman turns under the man's arm and he kisses her.
8 Last man and W1 turn as you would turn your partner.
8 Last couple face down the hall and do a double forward and back.
8 (or as many 8 s as needed) Last couple go to the bottom of the group at the bottom the woman turns under the man's arm and he kisses her.
8 Last couple turn your partner.

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ARGEERS
This dance is for two couples facing each other forming a group of four.
4 All dancers double forwards.
2 All dancers take your contrary's hands and slip two steps to the man's left/woman's right.
2 All dancers slip two steps to the man's right/woman's left.
4 All dancers change places with your contrary.
4 All dancers turn your partner one and a half times.
4 All dancers double forwards.
4 All dancers change places with your contrary while holding their hands.
8 All dancers turn your partner one and a half times.
4 Men change places.
4 Women change places.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
4 Women change places.
4 Men change places.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 Men take your contrary's left hand in your right hand and do a double away from the group.
4 All dancers do a double backward toward your partner.
8 Turn your partner.
4 With your partner do a double backward away from the group.
4 All dancers do a double toward your contrary.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
4 While facing your partner, men slip right while women slip left.
4 Men slip left while women slip right.
8 All dancers turn your contrary.
8 Women double toward the other woman and back.
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8 Men change places by right shoulders and go around your contrary back to where you started before changing places.

2 All dancers meet both hands with your contrary and men push the woman back a single.
4 All dancers, while holding the contrary's hands slip to the man's right and woman's left a double.
2 All women while meeting your contrary man with both hands push him back a single. (The preceding single double single is done as a 2-4-2 beat phrase while the music is a 44 beat phrase. Some dancers do this as an arc or a V forward a double then back a double at an angle to more comfortably fit the music. I have stuck to what is written in Playford here.)
8 All dancers set and turn left.
4 All dancers slip back to your original places with the women passing on the inside.
2 All dancers meet both hands with your contrary and men push the woman back a single.
2 All dancers meet both hands with your contrary and women push the man back a single.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 M 1 and W2 cast with their partners following.
8 W 1 and M2 cast with their partners following.
4 Half a hey for four starting with your partner.
4 Turn your partner.
4 Fall abreast to form a line facing the royalty
4 Reverence

## AYE ME, OR THE SIMPHONY

This dance is for four couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
2 Men single back.
2 Women single back.
4 All dancers turn.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
2 Men single back.
2 Women single back.
4 All dancers turn counter-clockwise.
4 C 1 cast to take C2's places while C4 cast to take C3s' places.
4 C 1 and C 4 change with your partner.
4 C 1 and C4 cast back to your partner's original places.
2 C 1 and C 4 change with your partner.
2 M1 and M2 change places counter-clockwise while holding hands while W1 and W2 change places clockwise while holding hands while M3 and M4 change places counterclockwise while holding hands while W3 and W4 change places clockwise while holding hands.
4 C 2 and C3 cast to their original places.
4 C 2 and C3 change with your partner.
4 C 2 cast to take the place of the person of the opposite sex from C 1 while C 3 cast to take the place of the person of the opposite sex from C4.
2 C 2 and C3 change with your partner.
2 M1 and M2 change places counter-clockwise while holding hands while W1 and W2 change places clockwise while holding hands while M3 and M4 change places counterclockwise while holding hands while W3 and W4 change places clockwise while holding hands.

4 All dancers half of a side left with your partner (you are finishing next to your partner's place.

4 Men a small double back.
4 Women a small double back.
4 All dancers turn to your partner's place.
4 All dancers half of a side right with your partner.
4 Men a small double back.
4 Women a small double back.
4 All dancers turn counter-clockwise to your original place.
4 All dancers facing up the hall C 1 and C 3 step away from your partner while C 2 and C 4 step toward your partner. Face your partner.
4 C1 slip into C2's place while C2 slip into C1's place while C3 slip into C4's place and C4 slip into C3's place. All dancers face down the hall.
4 C 2 and C 4 step away from your partner while C1 and C3 step toward your partner. Face your partner.
4 All dancers slip to their original places. Face up the hall
4 C 2 and C4 step away from your partner while C1 and C3 step toward your partner.
Face your partner
4 C1 slip into C2's place while C2 slip into C1's place while C3 slip into C4's place and C4 slip into C3's place. All dancers face down the hall.
4 C 1 and C3 step away from your partner while C2 and C4 step toward your partner.
Face your partner.
4 All dancers slip to their original places.
4 All dancers change places with your partner using right arms like half an arming. (you are finishing in your partner's place.
4 Men a small double back.
4 Women a small double back.
4 All dancers turn.
4 All dancers change places with your partner using left arms like half an arming. (you are finishing in your original place.
4 Men a small double back.
4 Women a small double back.
4 All dancers turn counter-clockwise to your original place.
4 C 1 and C 4 change places with C 1 going inside C 4 on the inside of the group while C 2 drifts into C1's places and C3 drifts into C4's places
4 C 1 and C 4 change with your partner.
4 M1 take M4's left hand in your right hand and change places with him counterclockwise while W1 take W4's left hand in your right hand and change places with her counter-clockwise.
4 C 1 and C 4 change with your partner.
4 C 2 and C3 change places with C2 going inside C3 on the inside of the group while C1 and C2 drift to their original places
4 C 2 and C 3 change with your partner.

4 M2 take M3's left hand in your right hand and change places with him counterclockwise while W2 take W3's left hand in your right hand and change places with her counter-clockwise.
4 C 2 and C3 change with your partner.

## BATH

This dance is for as many couples as wish in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 C 1 face each other and double back away from each other.
4 C1 slip down the hall into C2's places.
8 C 1 and C2 circle.
C1 progresses with this figure until they are at the bottom of the line and then work their way back up as the other couples progress down.
Once C 3 is immediately to the right of $\mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 2$ begins the sequence with all couples eventually being engaged. Continue until all couples have done a full circuit of the group.

8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 C 1 and C 2 change places with your partner.
4 C 1 and C 2 circle half way around so that C 1 is now in C2's place.
C1 progresses with this figure until they are at the bottom of the line and then work their way back up as the other couples progress down.
Once C3 is immediately to the right of C2, C2 begins the sequence with all couples eventually being engaged. Continue until all couples have done a full circuit of the group.

8 All dancers arm right.

8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers arm left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 M1 and M2 change places.
4 W 1 and W2 change places.
4 C 2 take hands and slip back to their original places while C1 slip back to their original places.
4 C 1 take hands and slip down the hall into C2's places while C2 slip up the hall into C1's places.
C1 progresses with this figure until they are at the bottom of the line and then work their way back up as the other couples progress down.
Once C3 is immediately to the right of C2, C2 begins the sequence with all couples eventually being engaged. Continue until all couples have done a full circuit of the group.

## BEGGAR BOY

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back
8 All dancers up a double and back
4 C 1 and C 3 double back away from your partner while C 2 does a double forward toward your partner.
4 All dancers double to your original places.
4 Men form a circle and go half way around.

If there was one type setting error then I believe there were two as the hey is typically the last chorus, not the second.

4 C 1 turn to face C 2 and C 1 and C 2 do a double forward to meet each other.
0 M1 take M2's right hand in your left hand while W1 takes W2's left hand in her right hand so you are back to back with your partner.
4 C 1 and C 2 do a double away from your partner.
0 C 1 and C 2 turn around to face your partner, taking the other hand of the person with whom you just doubled away from your partner.
4 C 1 and C2 do a double toward your partner.
0 C 1 and C2 take your partner's hand so you are back to back with the other couple.

(If there is an even number of couples, all the dancers could do the above pattern with the odd couples dancing with the couple immediately below them in the group).

4 C 1 and C 2 change places with your partner.
4 M1 and M2 change places while W1 and W2 change places.
4 C 1 and C 2 change places with your partner.
4 C 1 and C 2 set left and right to your partner.
4 C 1 and C3 change places with your partner.
4 M1 and M3 change places while W1 and W3 change places.
4 C 1 and C 3 change places with your partner.
4 C 1 and C 3 set left and right to your partner.
C 1 continues this pattern until they return to their original places.
The remaining couples do the pattern until all dancers have done this pattern.
(To speed things up, C2 may want to begin with C 3 when C 1 engages C 4 and so on).

## SCOTCH CAP

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers up a double and back.

4 The people in positions W1 and W2 and the people in positions M2 and M3 face the person across the group from you and double backward. (So W1's position and M2's positions are backing away from each other and W2's position and M3's position are backing away from each other).
4 The person in position W1 and the person in position M2 change places while the person in position W2 and the person in position M3 change places.
8 The person in position W3 and the person in position M1 change places.
4 The people in positions M1 and M2 and the people in positions W2 and W3 face the person across the group from you and double backward. (So M1's position and W2's positions are backing away from each other and M2's position and W3's position are backing away from each other).
4 The person in position M1 and the person in position W2 change places while the person in position M2 and the person in position W3 change places.
8 The person in position M3 and the person in position W1 change places. Repeat this pattern twice to return everyone to your original places.

8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers side right.

4 All dancers join hands in your lines by gender and double backwards away from your partner.
4 All dancers double forwards towards your partner.
8 M1 and M3 arm right while W1 and W3 arm right while C2 arms right.

4 All dancers join hands in your lines by gender and double backwards away from your partner.
4 All dancers double forwards towards your partner.
8 All dancers turn your partner.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers arm left.
4 All dancers join hands in your lines by gender and slip four steps to your left. (This should put the M3 opposite the W1).
4 M3 and W1 change places using right hands.
4 M3 and W2 change places using left hands WHILE M2 and W1 change places using left hands.
4 All dancers change with your partner using both hands.
4 All dancers join hands in your lines by gender and slip four steps to your right.
4 M1 and W3 change places using right hands.
4 M2 and W3 change places using left hands While M1 and W2 change places using left hands.
4 All dancers change with your partner using both hands.

## SHEPHEARDS HOLYDAY

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
4 All dancers change places with your partner.
8 All dancers go down the hall a double and back.
4 All dancers change places with your partner.
4 C1 slip down the hall between C2.
4 C3 slip up the hall outside C2 to C1's places.
4 All dancers turn.
4 C3 slip up the hall between C2.
4 C 1 slip down the hall outside C2.
4 All dancers turn.
8 All dancers side left.
4 All dancers change places with your partner.
8 All dancers side right.
4 All dancers change places with your partner.
4 All dancers join hands in your lines by gender and double backwards away from your partner.
4 All dancers double forwards towards your partner.
4 All dancers form a circle with your own gender and circle.
4 All dancers reform your lines by gender and double backwards away from your partner.
4 All dancers double forwards towards your partner.
4 All dancers form a circle with your own gender facing outward from the circle and circle.

8 All dancers arm right.
4 All dancers change places with your partner.
8 All dancers arm left.
4 All dancers change places with your partner.
4 M1 and W2 change places while W1 and M2 change places.
4 M1 and M3 change places while W1 and W3 change places.
4 W2 and M3 change places while M2 and W3 change places.
4 W2 and M1 change places while M2 and W1 change places.
4 M1 and M3 change places while W1 and W3 change places.
4 M2 and W3 change places while W2 and M3 change places.

## SKELLAMESAGO

This dance is for as many couples as will in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 C 1 arm right one and a half times around going between C 2 to their places.
4 M1 set with W2 while W1 sets with M2.
4 C 1 change places.
C 1 progresses with this figure until they are at the bottom of the line and then work their way back up as the other couples progress down.
Once C 3 is again immediately to the right of $\mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 2$ begins the pattern with all couples eventually being engaged. Continue until all couples have done a full circuit of the group.

8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn right.

4 C1 slip down between C2
4 C 1 change places with your partner while holding hands WHILE C2 turn your partner
4 C 1 and C2 turn your contrary.
4 C1 change places with your partner while holding hands WHILE C2 turn your partner C 1 progresses with this pattern until they are at the bottom of the line and then work their way back up as the other couples progress down.
Once C 3 is immediately to the right of $\mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 2$ begins the pattern with all couples eventually being engaged. Continue until all couples have done a full circuit of the group.

## SLIP

This dance is for as many couples as wish in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers reverence the royalty.
8 All dancers reverence your partner.
0 M1 take M2's left hand in your right while W1 take W2's right hand in your left.
4 C 1 and C2 double back away from your partner.
4 M1 and W2 step to the left with their right foot trailing while W1 and M2 step to the right with their left foot trailing. (do not transfer weight to the trailing foot)
8 C 1 and C 2 change places with partner.
0 M1 take M2's left hand in your right while W1 take W2's right hand in your left.
4 C 1 and C2 double back away from your partner.
4 M1 and W2 step to the left with their right foot trailing while W1 and M2 step to the right with their left foot trailing. (do not transfer weight to the trailing foot)
8 C 1 and C 2 change places with partner.
8 C 1 do a double down the hall to be halfway down the group and reverence your partner.
8 C 1 do a double down the hall to the bottom of the group and reverence your partner.
0 W1 take last woman's right hand in your left while M1 take last man's left hand in your right while W3 take W2's left hand in your right while M3 take M2's right hand in your left.
4 All dancers who just joined hands double back away from your partner.
4 M1, last woman, M2 and W3 step to the left with their right foot trailing then step to the right while W1, last man, W2 and M3 step to the right then step to the left. 4 All dancers who had joined hands change places with partner.
0 M1 take M2's left hand in your right while W1 take W2's right hand in your left.

4 All dancers who had joined hands double back away from your partner.

M1 continue with this pattern until he has worked his to the end of the line.
Then W1 does this pattern.

(You may want to have the women start right after their partner has gone so the dance goes faster so as M1 is setting to W2 W1 is setting to M2)

4 C 1 do a double down the line to C 2 .

The remaining couples do the pattern until all dancers have done this pattern.
(To speed things up, C 2 may want to begin with C 3 when C 1 engages C 4 and so on).

This dance is for four couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers double past your partner passing right shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing left shoulders.
8 All dancers turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 All dancers double past your partner passing left shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing right shoulders.
8 All dancers turn your partner counter-clockwise without joining hands.
0 C 1 turn to face C 4 while C 2 and C 3 move back to create a rectangle.
8 C 1 and C 4 double to meet in the middle of the group and double back.
8 C 1 and C 4 double to meet in the middle of the group and double back.
8 M1 and M4 double past each other passing right shoulders and double backwards passing left shoulders. WHILE W1 and W4 double past each other passing right shoulders and double backwards passing left shoulders
8 M1 and M4 turn as you would turn your partner clockwise without joining hands. WHILE W1 and W4 turn as you would turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 M1 and M4 double past each other passing left shoulders and double backwards passing right shoulders. WHILE W1 and W4 double past each other passing left shoulders and double backwards passing right shoulders
8 M1 and M4 turn as you would turn your partner counter-clockwise without joining hands. WHILE W1 and W4 turn as you would turn your partner counter-clockwise without joining hands.

8 All dancers double past your partner passing left shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing right shoulders.
8 All dancers turn your partner counter-clockwise without joining hands.
0 C 1 turn to face C 4 while C 2 and C 3 move back to create a rectangle.
8 C 1 and C 4 double to meet in the middle of the group and double back.
8 C 1 and C 4 double to meet in the middle of the group and double back.
8 M1 and M4 double past each other passing right shoulders and double backwards passing left shoulders. WHILE W1 and W4 double past each other passing right shoulders and double backwards passing left shoulders
8 M1 and M4 turn as you would turn your partner clockwise without joining hands. WHILE W1 and W4 turn as you would turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 C 1 and C 4 take hands and circle.
8 C 1 and C 4 take hands and circle counter-clockwise.
8 C 2 and C3 double past your partner passing right shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing left shoulders.
8 C 2 and C3 turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 C 2 and C3 take hands and circle.
8 C 2 and C3 take hands and circle counter-clockwise.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers arm left.

8 All dancers double past your partner passing right shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing left shoulders.
8 All dancers turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 All dancers double past your partner passing left shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing right shoulders.
8 All dancers turn your partner counter-clockwise without joining hands.
0 C 1 turn to face C 4 while C 2 and C 3 move back to create a rectangle.
8 C 1 and C 4 double to meet in the middle of the group and double back.
8 C 1 and C 4 double to meet in the middle of the group and double back.
8 M1 and M4 double past each other passing right shoulders and double backwards passing left shoulders. WHILE W1 and W4 double past each other passing right shoulders and double backwards passing left shoulders

8 M1 and M4 turn as you would turn your partner clockwise without joining hands. WHILE W1 and W4 turn as you would turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 C 1 and C 4 join right hands in the middle and circle.
8 C 1 and C 4 join left hands in the middle and circle counter-clockwise.
8 C 2 and C3 double past your partner passing right shoulders and double backwards past your partner passing left shoulders.
8 C 2 and C3 turn your partner clockwise without joining hands.
8 C 2 and C 3 join right hands in the middle and circle.
8 C 2 and C 3 join left hands in the middle and circle counter-clockwise.

## SPANYARD

This dance is for four couples in a line all facing the same direction.
4 All dancers up the hall a double.
4 All dancers do four slips to the right.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
4 All dancers down the hall a double.
4 All dancers do four slips to the right. (You are facing the opposite direction, so this brings you back to your original places).
8 All dancers set and turn right.
4 C 1 and C 4 fall back while C 2 and C 3 meet their partners.
4 C 2 slips up the hall between C1 while C3 slips down the hall between C 4 .
8 All dancers set and turn left.
4 C 2 and C3 fall back while C1 and C4 meet their partners.
4 C 1 slips up the hall between C 2 while C 4 slips down the hall between C 3 .
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 M1 and M3 with both hands push your women back a double while W2 and W4 with both hands push their men back a double with C 1 trading places with C 2 and C 3 trading places with C4.
8 All dancers set and turn left.

8 M2 and M4 with both hands push your women back a double while the W1 and W3 with both hands push their men back a double with C 1 trading places with C 2 and C 3 trading places with C 4 .
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers set and turn left.

8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 M1 and W2 double to meet and double backward to place while M3 and W4 double to meet and double backward to place.
8 M1 and W2 turn your contrary one and a half times while M3 and W4 turn your contrary one and a half times.
8 W1 and M2 double to meet and double backward to place while W3 and M4 double to meet and double backward to place.
8 W 1 and M2 turn your contrary one and a half times while W3 and M4 turn your contrary one and a half times.
8 M1 and W2 double to meet and double backward to place while M3 and W4 double to meet and double backward to place.
8 M1 and W2 turn your contrary one and a half times while M3 and W4 turn your contrary one and a half times.
8 W1 and M2 double to meet and double backward to place while W3 and M4 double to meet and double backward to place.
8 W1 and M2 turn your contrary one and a half times while W3 and M4 turn your contrary one and a half times.

## STAINES MORRIS

This dance is for as many couples as wish in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers turn one quarter turn to the left and do a double forward. Turn half way round and return to original places with a double.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 M1 go down the hall to the last woman.
8 M1 side left with the last woman.
4 M1 take last woman by left hands.
4 M1 take last woman by right hands so you are holding both hands.
4 M1 and last woman change places clockwise and reverence.
4 M1 and last woman change places counter-clockwise and reverence.
8 M1 and last women go up to the front of the line. All the other women have moved one spot down the line.

8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers turn one quarter turn to the left and do a double forward. Turn half way round and return to original places with a double.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 M1 go down the hall to the last woman.

8 M1 side left with the last woman.
4 M1 take last woman by left hands.
4 M1 take last woman by right hands so you are holding both hands.
4 M1 and last woman change places clockwise and reverence.
4 M1 and last woman change places counter-clockwise and reverence.
8 M1 and last women go up to the front of the line. All the other women have moved one spot down the line.

The entire dance repeats until all the women return to their original places.

## STEP STATELEY

This dance is for groups of an odd number of couples in a line.
(Playford says for an odd number of couples, but it really is best done with three couples.)

4 All dancers up the hall a double.
4 All dancers change places with your partner while still facing up the hall with the men slipping behind their partners.
0 All dancers face away from your partner so you are back to back.
0 All dancers join hands in your lines by gender.
8 C 1 cast leading their respective lines down the hall and forming a line M3 M2 M1 W1
W2 W3 Facing up the hall. (Playford says W2 leads the line, but the next instruction has W1 in the place W2 would be if she lead the line).
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 Women slip right while men slip left with the women passing in front of the men going up their lines to their original places.

8 C 1 go up the hall a double turn to face the opposite direction and go down the hall a double.
4 C 1 and C2 take hands in a circle and circle half way around.
4 M1 and W2 change places.
8 W 1 and W2 go between M1 and M2 with W2 leading and going around M1 to stand behind M1 and W1 going to stand behind M2.
4 M1 and M2 change places using your right hands.
4 C 1 and C 2 change places with your partner using your left hands finishing with C 1 in C2's places and C2 in C1's places. (C1 will have turned $11 / 2$ times).

8 C 1 go up the hall between C 2 crossing to the other side so W 1 casts in front of M2 back to M2's place M1 casts in front of W2 back to W2's place.

$4 \mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 1$ and C 3 join hands in your lines by gender and double backwards away from your partner.
(The following two sections require an extra repeat of the first half of the music).
4 C 2 and C 3 change places with your partner while C 1 does a double toward your partner.
$4 \mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 1$ and C3 double backward

8 C1 lead up the hall a double and cast back to C3's places while M2 and M3 change places and W2 and W3 change places.
8 C 1 arm right while C 2 and C 3 join hands in a circle and circle half way around.

## STINGO, OR THE OYLE OF BARLEY

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.

8 All dancers back away a double from your partner and double back to place and face forward.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 Men join right hands and circle.
8 Men set and turn left.
8 Women join left hands and circle.
8 Women set and right.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers turn one quarter turn to the left and do a double forward. Turn half way round and return to original places with a double. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers turn one quarter turn to the right and do a double forward. Turn half way round and return to original places with a double. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers arm left.

4 C 1 change places into the middle of the set, lady going first, finishing just before M 1 is between W2 and W3 and W1 is between M2 and M3.
2 M1 set left to W2 while W1 set left to M2.
2 M1 set right to W3 while M1 set right to M3.
4 M1 go between W2 and W3 and continue up the hall to W1's place WHILE W1 go between M2 and M3 and continue up the hall to W1's place
4 C 1 change places ending in your original place.
4 C 1 cast up the hall and return to original place, effectively a glorified turn.
8 C 1 turn your partner. (Yes you are across the music here.)
4 C 1 cast down the hall with all other couples following until the set is inverted.

## TOM TINKER

This dance is for an even number of as many couples in a line as wish all facing the same direction. C 1 will be interacting with $\mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 3$ will be interacting with $\mathrm{C} 4, \mathrm{C} 5$ will be interacting with C 6 etc. The odd numbered couples do what C 1 is doing and the even numbered couples do what C 2 is doing

4 All dancers go forward a double.
4 Without letting go of your partner's hand, change places with your partner so you are now facing down the hall.
4 All dancers go forward a double.
4 Without letting go of your partner's hand, change places with your partner so you are now facing $u p$ the hall in your original places.

2 M1 slip between C2 to stand between C2.
2 W 1 slip outside the group to be next to W2 so the dancers form a line, W1, W2, M1, M2.
4 C 1 cast down the hall ending in C2's places while C2 cast up the hall ending in C1's places.
2 M 2 slip between C 1 to stand between C 1 .
2 W 2 slip outside the group to be next to W1 so the dancers form a line, W2, W1, M2, M1.
4 C 2 cast down the hall ending while C 1 cast up the hall ending in your original places.

4 C 1 do a quarter turn to the left and do a double forward with the woman following the man while C 2 do a quarter turn to the right and do a double forward with the man following the woman.
4 C 1 face up the hall and M1 take your partner's left hand in your right hand and C1 double backward while C 2 face down the hall and M2 take your partner's left hand in your right hand and C2 double backward. The doubles backward are done at a slight angle so that C1 finishes in C2's places and C2 finishes in C1's places.

8 Arm right with your partner C1 ending in C2's places and C2 finishes in C1's places.

## UP TAYLES ALL

As many couples as will in a circle.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8. Going between $\mathrm{C} 2, \mathrm{C} 1$ cast around the person of the opposite sex in C 2 ending between C2 and clap hands.
8 C 1 arm right.
C1 repeat this pattern with C3.
The dance progresses with C 1 continuing around the circle and, assuming there are more than 3 couples, C 2 starts this pattern with C 3 when C 1 starts with C 4 . Continue until all dancers are back to their original places.

8 Going between C2, C1 cast around the person of the opposite sex in C2 ending between C 2 and clap hands.
8 C 1 and C 2 join right hands and circle with C 1 finishing in C 2 's places.
C1 repeat this pattern with C3.
The dance progresses with C 1 continuing around the circle and, assuming there are more than 3 couples, C 2 starts this pattern with C 3 when C 1 starts with C 4 . Continue until all dancers are back to their original places.

8 Going between C2, C1 cast around the person of the opposite sex in C2 ending between C 2 and clap hands.

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn left. Face up the hall.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner.
8 All dancers set and turn right.

## CHORUS

0 Men take hands in a line facing the women.
0 Women take hands in a line facing the men.
4 Forward a double to meet your partner.
4 Back a double.
8 The man and woman at the head of the line release the hands of the others in their line and go under the joined hands of the people of the same sex in their line continuing on to finish at the bottom of the line.
Repeat the chorus pattern twice so all dancers end in their original places
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn right.

Chorus
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers arm left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.

## WHIRLIGIG

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 C 2 go up the hall between C 1 and cast back to place going behind C 1 .
8 C 2 continue and cross, lady first, as they go up the hall between C 1 , going behind C 1
and going back to place by crossing again.
16 C2 then repeats all this with C3 replacing C1's role.
16 All dancers cast with C1 leading and forming an arch when they are in C3's places so that C2 winds up in C1's place and C3 finishes in the middle.
32 C3 now performs the pattern that C2 did.
16 All dancers cast again with C 1 finishing in the middle.
32 C 1 now performs the pattern that C2 originally did.
16 All dancers cast again with everyone returning to your original places.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers side right.
16 M2 arm right with W1 and continue with a hey in a group with C1. At the same time, W2 arm right with M3 and continue with a hey in a group with C3.
16 Repeat the arming and hey with M2 going to C3 and W2 going to C 1 .

16 All dancers cast with C1 leading and forming an arch when they are in C3's places so that C2 winds up in C1's place and C3 finishes in the middle.
32 C 3 now performs the arming and hey pattern that C 2 did.
16 All dancers cast again with C 1 finishing in the middle.
32 C 1 now performs the arming and hey pattern that C 2 originally did.
16 All dancers cast again with everyone returning to your original places.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers arm left.
8 C 1 cast with C2 following. C1 pass through C2's places as both couple return to their original places.
8 C 1 and C 2 join right hands and circle once around to their original places.
16 C 2 repeats all this with C3 replacing C1's role.
16 All dancers cast with C1 leading and forming an arch when they are in C3's places so that C2 winds up in C1's place and C3 finishes in the middle.
32 C3 now performs the casting and circling pattern that C 2 did.
16 All dancers cast again with C 1 finishing in the middle.
32 C 1 now performs the casting and circling pattern that C 2 originally did.
16 All dancers cast again with everyone returning to your original places.

## WHISH

This dance is for three couples in a line all facing the same direction.
8 All dancers up a double and back. Face your partner
8 All dancers set and double back away from your partner (Very small double).
8 All dancers up a double and back.
8 All dancers set and double back away from your partner (Very small double).
8 M2 go between W1 and W2 and go around W2's back to original place. M1
IMMEDIATELY follow M2 between W1 and W2 and go around W1's back to original place.
8 M 1 and M 2 arm right. (I prefer C 1 and C 2 turn your partner, but I think having the men arm is a more accurate reconstruction.)
8 M2 go between the W2 and W3 and go around W2 back to original place. M3
IMMEDIATELY follow M2 between W2 and W3 and go around the W3's back to original place.
8 M2 and M3 arm left. (I prefer C1 and C2 turn your partner, but I think having the men arm is a more accurate reconstruction.)

32 W2 leads the women in the same pattern as M2 just did.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers set and double back away from your partner (Very small double).

8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and double back away from your partner (Very small double).
8 C 2 goes up the hall between C 1 then cast around the person of the same sex returns to place.
8 C 2 turn your partner. (Again, I prefer C 1 and C 2 turn your partner, but I think just having C2 turn your partner is a more accurate reconstruction.)
8 C 2 goes down the hall between C 3 then cast around the person of the same sex returns to place.
8 C 2 turn your partner. (Again, I prefer C1 and C2 turn your partner, but I think just having C2 turn your partner is a more accurate reconstruction.)

8 M2 go between W1 and W2 and go around W2 back to original place. M1 IMMEDIATELY follow M2 between W1 and W2 and go around W1's back to original place.
8 M1 and M2 arm right.
8 M2 go between the W2 and W3 and go around W2 back to original place. M3
IMMEDIATELY follow M2 between W2 and W3 and go around W3's back to original place.
8 M2 and M3 arm left.
W2 leads the women in the same pattern as the M2 just did.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers set and double back away from your partner (Very small double).
8 All dancers arm left.
8 All dancers set and double back away from your partner (Very small double).
8 C2 crosses between C1, woman first, taking C1's places in the line of the other sex. 8 C 2 crosses between C 1 , woman first, returning to original places.
8 C2 crosses between C3, woman first, taking C3's places in the line of the other sex. 8 C 2 crosses between C 3 , woman first, returning to original places.
(I have seen a reconstruction where C2 goes around the person of the opposite sex and then around the person of the same sex and this seems more fun, but I do not see it in Playford.)

8 M2 go between W1 and W2 and go around W2 back to original place. M1 IMMEDIATELY follow M2 between W1 and W2 and go around W1's back to original place.
8 M1 and M2 arm right.
8 M2 go between the W2 and W3 and go around W2 back to original place. M3
IMMEDIATELY follow M2 between W2 and W3 and go around W3's back to original place.
8 M2 and M3 arm left.
W2 leads the women in the same pattern as the M2 just did.

8 All dancers set and turn left.

16 C 2 go up the hall between C 1 cast around the person of the same sex in C 1 and continue down the hall to perform the same figure with C 3 and return to place.

8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 All dancers side left.
8 All dancers side right.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 M 2 go between W 1 and W 2 going around W 1 to return to place while W 2 goes between the M2 and M3 going around M3 to return to place.

8 M 2 go between W2 and W3 going around W3 to return to place while W2 goes between M1 and M2 going around M1 to return to place.

8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
8 All dancers arm right.
8 All dancers arm left.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
16 Men hey in a line.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
16 Women hey in a line.
8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
16 All dancers hey as a group._ Have M1 and M2 change first while W1 and W2 change and C3 changes then C2 changes while M1 and W3 change and W1 and M3 change continuing until everyone returns to their original places.

8 All dancers set and turn left.
8 All dancers set and turn right.
